President's Comments

It is April and we can assume that the long winter is finally over. Signs of spring are showing up, including the severe and unpredictable weather conditions. So be careful, bad weather with wind rain and lightning can develop quickly.

If you have checked the bands lately, conditions have really improved, there were some contests and the bands were crowded with DX stations.

One event last Sunday morning underlines this: there was a sudden band outage on HF (I noticed it on 7 MHz). It lasted maybe ½ hour before the signals were almost back to normal. I personally remember only one previous experience. Maybe we all ran into this before without realizing it, just blamed it on "poor conditions". However, this effect, first noticed in 1930 by a German Engineer by the name of Moegel and later corroborated and reported in 1935 by the American Dellinger is known as the Moegel-Dellinger effect. A strong burst of radiation from the sun (x-rays) ionizes the lower layers of the ionosphere and prevents all short waves from getting reflected by the higher layers. It only happens during high solar activity!

There are only a few weeks to Hamvention. For the banquet we have the artist Richard Black give us the same presentation that we enjoyed at our Christmas luncheon. So if you missed it then, now you have a chance to see it.

Our speaker's long carrier started about the same time as WW2. He was transferred to Wright Patterson AB to draw up conceptual pictures of future aircraft. And who has not seen Mr. Clean or Smoky the Bear, two of his creations! Richard and his late wife made his home in Kettering, where he still resides and works. I hope we have a good showing of local hams who attend the banquet.
